



SERVICE AREA




Komen Greater NYC's service area includes nine counties and over 12 million people, which is 64% of the population of New York State.

FINANCIALS


For the fiscal year ending March 31, 2016, Komen Greater NYC had revenues of \$7.3 million, including in-kind goods and services of \$3.1 million and applied \$204,302 from reserves to offset expenses of \$7.5 million. Expenses included \$3.8 million invested in mission-related programs and activities, which includes \$1.4 million allocated to local community grants and \$698,000 invested in national research programs to find the cures.
